Cedars-Sinai Welcomes Ravi Thadhani, MD, MPH as Vice Dean of **Research and Education**

Last November Cedars-Sinai appointed Ravi Thadhani, MD, MPH as Vice Dean of Research and Education. Dr. Thadhani comes from Harvard Medical School as Professor of Medicine. and Chief of the Division of Nephrology at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston. He also served as the executive director of

the Clinical Trials Office at Partners Healthcare in Boston. Dr. Thadhani is a highly accomplished investigator, scholar educator, and clinician who brings his considerable leadership skills to enrich the academic enterprise.

He was kind enough to answer the following questions.

1. What brought you to Cedars-Sinai?

RT: Cedars-Sinai is an amazing clinical hospital that is on an inflection with respect to its research presence, both nationally and internationally. I wanted to be part of this growth, and have the opportunity to work with the leadership here who have made research a priority.

2. What is your vision for research and education at Cedars-Sinai?

RT: My goal is to create an environment where patients are our partners in research, and where we have trained the next generation of investigators, from basic to clinical/translational scientists.

3. What are your goals and/or focus for your first six months at Cedars-Sinai?

RT: My focus for the next 6 months is to ensure the foundation for research at Cedars-Sinai is well positioned to handle the challenges and importantly the opportunities that will present themselves in the next 10 years.

4. What have been your most significant leadership successes and challenges on your pathway to your current role?

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RT: At Partner's Healthcare in Boston I established the Clinical Trials Office for the 5 major hospitals in our system.

Our team reduced the turn around times for contract and budget completion by 50% over a two year period. In addition, I was the Chief of Nephrology at Massachusetts General Hospital where I was proud of many milestones including raising funds for our first Endowed Chair positions, doubling the size of our women faculty, and tripling the number of underrepresented minority faculty, all in a span of 4 years.

5. What experiences in your past do you anticipate will be important to your role as Vice Dean for Research and Education?

RT: Experiences I will rely on will be steering research growth in the face of economic uncertainty, identifying young talent that need support at a critical juncture, and promoting research education among young investigators.

INAUGURAL FACULTY DEVELOPMENT AND DIVERSITY COUNCIL
