JONATHAN HALEVY, M.D., DIRECTOR OF SHAARE ZEDEK MEDICAL CENTER IN ISRAEL, TO DISCUSS IMPACT OF URBAN TERROR ON HOSPITAL OPERATIONS

What: Jonathan Halevy, M.D., Director General of Shaare Zedek Medical Center in Jerusalem, Israel, will discuss emergency preparedness, staff performance and social implications relative to urban terror and hospital operations.

Who Professor Jonathan Halevy, M.D. is Director General of the Shaare Zedek Medical Center in Jerusalem. He is a clinical Associate Professor of Medicine at Ben-Gurion University of the Negev and Chairman of the Israel Transplant Society.

Why: The growing incidence of urban terrorist activity in the United States and abroad has had a significant impact on hospital operations. In his presentation, Professor Halevy will discuss:

- Emergency medical responses to urban terror
- Evaluation and treatment of victims of nuclear, chemical and biological terror
