Description

The Cedars-Sinai MICU is a 24-bed critical care facility that is fully equipped for hemodynamic monitoring, dialysis, and respiratory support. Students are expected to be knowledgeable in medicine, obstetrics, surgery, and physiology and to have a major interest in the medical management of the critically ill.

Course Objectives

- Knowledge of the pathophysiology, differential diagnosis, and medical management of critical illnesses.
- Clinical skills: medical interviewing, physical examination, and integration of data obtained from invasive hemodynamic and respiratory monitoring.
- Medical decision-making: analysis of medical risk benefit ratios and understanding of ethical and legal issues.
- Diagnosis and management of complex in-patient problems, including pre and post-operative surgical care.
- Oral presentations of clinical cases.
- Knowledge of pharmacology of cardioactive drugs, bronchodilator therapy, parenteral nutrition, and antibiotics
- Familiarity with hemodynamic monitoring equipment, mechanical ventilators, and dialysis devices
- Basic science and pathophysiology of critical illness.
- Interaction with critically ill patients and their families.

Additional Comments/Special Requirements	Each student will be assigned to a team consisting of a resident and an intern on-call every third night. The students will be under the supervision of full-time attendings and private physicians. Daily work rounds are held with the attending physician and fellow in critical care medicine. Numerous subspecialty consultants from the private and full-time attending staff are available. In addition, formal didactic conferences will be given four times weekly.
