Requirement(s)

- Students must have completed a neurology clerkship prior to taking this course.
- Students must write a statement of interest (why interested in this course) and submit it along with their application.

Description

Students have the option to participate in either a 3-week stroke-focused rotation or a 3-week rotation in the outpatient clinic and neurology wards. The type of rotation is assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. During the rotation, students will gain hands-on experience in evaluating and managing a wide range of common neurological conditions, including stroke, seizures, altered mental status, multiple sclerosis, neurobehavioral disorders, neuromuscular conditions, headaches, and movement disorders. The multidisciplinary team includes neurology, medicine, anesthesia, and neurosurgery residents, as well as second-year medical students, all working under the guidance of a faculty member. Students will also engage in a variety of educational activities, such as weekly lectures, seminars, and grand round presentations, providing a comprehensive learning experience.

Course Objectives

- Ability to obtained pertinent history and perform detailed neurological examination to localize abnormalities within the nervous system.
- Develop comprehensive differential diagnosis and prioritize appropriate workup for patients with neurological disease.
- Discuss risks and benefits of medications commonly used for neurological disease.
- Work effectively as part of a healthcare team.
- Identify and utilize community resources for patients with neurological disorders.
- · Develop and deliver a brief oral presentation to the team
