Requirement(s)

Students should have an interest in learning more about the growing field of allergy/immunology. They will be assigned recommended reading and patient cases.

Description

1. The student will attend both adult and pediatric allergy/immunology clinics, in order to gain comprehensive exposure to the field. They will see new and follow-up patients.
2. The student will be given reading materials including journal articles and patient cases, which will be discussed with the allergy/immunology attending.
3. The student must attend all regularly scheduled resident education conferences: grand rounds and noon conference.
4. At the end of the rotation, the student will give a brief presentation on an allergy/immunology topic of their choice.
5. The student is expected to do all in-hospital consults during the week and present these to the attending on call.

Course Objectives

- Learn how to take a targeted history for allergic/immunologic conditions and perform a focused physical exam
- Gain exposure to common procedures performed in allergy clinic, including skin testing, food challenges, drug challenges, allergen immunotherapy, etc.
- Learn how to diagnose and treat hypersensitivity reactions.
- Learn step-wise approaches to managing chronic conditions such as asthma, chronic urticaria, and atopic dermatitis
- Understand medical management and lifestyle interventions for achieving control of rhinitis
- Understand the typical presentation of various food allergies
- Become familiar with the basic approach to a patient with suspected immunodeficiency.
