## Description

This rotation is designed for medical students who are interested in the field of radiation oncology or another oncologic specialty, to get exposure to the field as well as understand and learn the concepts of radiation biology, physics, stereotactic radiosurgery, stereotactic radiotherapy, IMRT, IGRT, as well as gain familiarity with the commonly encountered cancers. The students will be working with different attending staff throughout the rotation and will also be attending multidisciplinary conferences. The student is expected to see consult or follow-up patients and then formally present the case to the attending, providing pertinent and clinically relevant information from the H&P, imaging studies, pathology, and any outside records, and will be expected ultimately to formulate treatment options under the guidance of the attending. The student will also be expected to either type or dictate the H&P, follow-up, or on-treatment visit note in the EMR (EPIC). During this 4-week rotation, the student will formally present to the entire department a patient case-based presentation on a specific topic/disease process usually related to a patient seen by the student. This presentation is expected to entail a full discussion of the anatomy, staging, treatment options, as well as the relevant literature surrounding the chosen topic.

## Course Objectives

1. The student should understand the risk factors, radiation treatment options for breast cancer, brain tumors, gastrointestinal tract tumors, and gynecological cancers, especially endometrial cancer.
2. The student should understand how the radiation therapy is utilized and mechanism of action specifically in conjunction with other modalities, like chemotherapy.
3. The student will understand the relative benefits of various radiation modalities, such as: 3D conformal, IMRT, IGRT and SBRT, SRS, and brachytherapy
